For everything you order online in December—please try to buy something locally as well. Over the next few days, I'll run some whimsical items, some clothes, a few must-haves and a couple of practical suggestions.

Although our little town now has some chain stores, in this year's shopping adventure, I focused mostly on our mom-and-pop stores, which are locally owned and need our support more than ever.

The moment you walk in the door, you know you'll find something fun and I wasn't disappointed with a large selection of *jigsaw puzzles (\$22 to \$30)*. This store is where one of our former honorary mayors loved to shop for costume jewelry. There is also a nice selection of linens and silver. Every year I double check to see if they have it—and they do, yum, a great stocking gift for someone who has everything. While I was at the store this year, I discovered *exquisite snow globes (\$50 to \$78)*.
